IDENTIFY CONCERNS

ACT



Create a video that explains how to make puppy chow properly, with an easy recipe anyone can follow when providing childcare. Then make a slideshow to incorporate into the video, along with a voiceover, so all steps and directions are thorough and shown.

To make our video, we knew we wanted a recipe that required minimal ingredients and took a small amount of time, so we created and tested numerous recipes to find one that not only tasted good, but checked all the boxes. We then created a small script that included the recipe as long as safety reminders.

Lastly, we created our video that explained all procedures for childcare providers to follow.

FOLLOW UP



After making our recipe and video, we feel we could have explained some steps more thoroughly. However, we went over every step and made sure of any hazards that could occur.

Additionally, when editing our video we realized we had filmed the video vertically rather than horizontal, so it took some time trying to edit our slideshow and videos together, with them not completely lining up.
